
City Manager's Bi-Weekly COMMUNITY UPDATE

BRIGHT OUTLOOK FOR CITY SALES TAX REVENUES

As was the case with many other cities around the country, sales tax revenues took a hit during the recent pandemic period. Fortunately, there are promising numbers forecasted showing an 11% increase in Walnut's sales tax revenue for this past fiscal year (2021-2022). With continued economic growth, economic development programs, and the community's support of local businesses, sales tax revenue should continue to see an upward trend in fiscal year 2022-2023. Now, more than ever, it is important to fuel up, eat, and shop in Walnut whenever possible.

SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

The City Council recently adopted an outlay of funds for American Rescue Plan Act money (approximately \$7 million) received from the Federal Government. \$550,000 has been earmarked to assist small businesses in the City of Walnut. A robust program is now being developed by the City's Community Development department in order to properly distribute these funds to eligible businesses. This is another step taken by the City Council to make sure that the city and its small businesses continue to thrive.



CITY COMMISSIONS VACANCIES

Applications for vacant seats on City commissions are now being accepted by the City Clerk's office. Serving on a City commission is a fantastic way to serve your community.

- The terms for all City commissioners are set to expire on June 30, 2022.
- The City Clerk's office is accepting applications for all City commissions.
- In order to qualify for the Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, and/or Senior Commission, each applicant must be a resident over 18-years-old and legally registered to vote in the City of Walnut.
- Applicants for the Youth Advisory Commission (YAC) must be residents currently enrolled in high school and are required to complete the YAC supplemental application packet.
