Three Ways to be Contacted in an Emergency

Wireless Emergency Alerts (W.E.A.)

W.E.A. are urgent alerts sent to your cell phone based on your location. A W.E.A. may fall under one of three alert categories: Imminent Threat, AMBER and Presidential.

Message may be sent out by the County of Los Angeles, the State of California or the Federal Government.

Registration <u>not</u> required

Everbridge

Everbridge is a free alert system for Walnut residents. Alerts may be sent regarding a variety of situations, such as natural disasters, major unexpected road closures, or area evacuations.

Residents may select how they are electronically notified (cell phone, email and/or text).

Alert LA

Alert LA is the free mass notification system for Los Angeles County residents and businesses. The County Sheriff's Department uses Alert LA to contact you if there is an emergency or disaster in your community.
