**Five Tier Response Level(s)**

Similar to cities with established Coyote Management Plan(s) and the intent of the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) Regional Coyote Management Plan, the following Exhibit 1 is the Five (5) Tier Response Level System when encountering a coyote:

*Exhibit 1. Coyote Five (5) Tier Response System*

<b>Tier</b>	<b>Coyote Behavior</b>	<b>Response Level</b>	<b>Check Here</b>
<b>Sighting</b>	Coyote heard or seen moving through an area (The sighting can be either during the day or night)	1	
<b>Stalking</b>	Coyote following people or stalking certain locations	2	
	Coyote frequenting areas with food sources		
	Coyote does not appear alarmed by human presence		
<b>Hunting</b>	Coyote entering yards	3	
	Coyote entering residential home		
	Coyote attempts to remove domesticated animal from residence or property		
<b>Attacking</b>	Coyote is involved in an attack with a domesticated animal	4	
<b>Extreme Aggression</b>	Coyote attacks a person*	5	
	Coyote kills a domesticated animal
